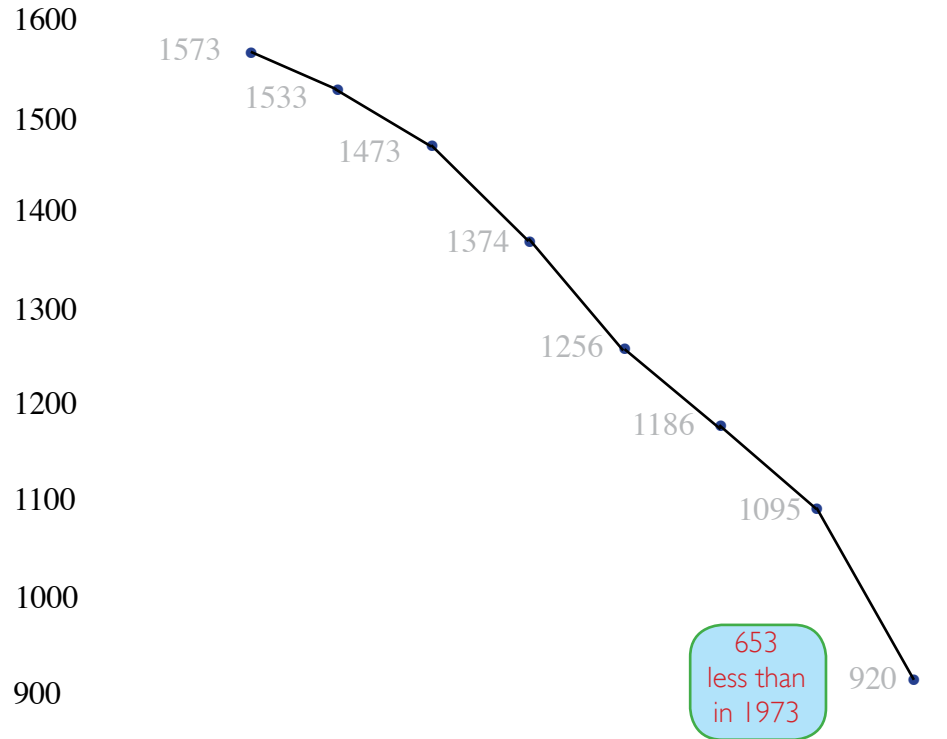


Enrollment History K-5

Enrollment for the 7 Years leading up to Loker's 1980 closing

1973 1974 1975 1976 1977 1978 1979 1980



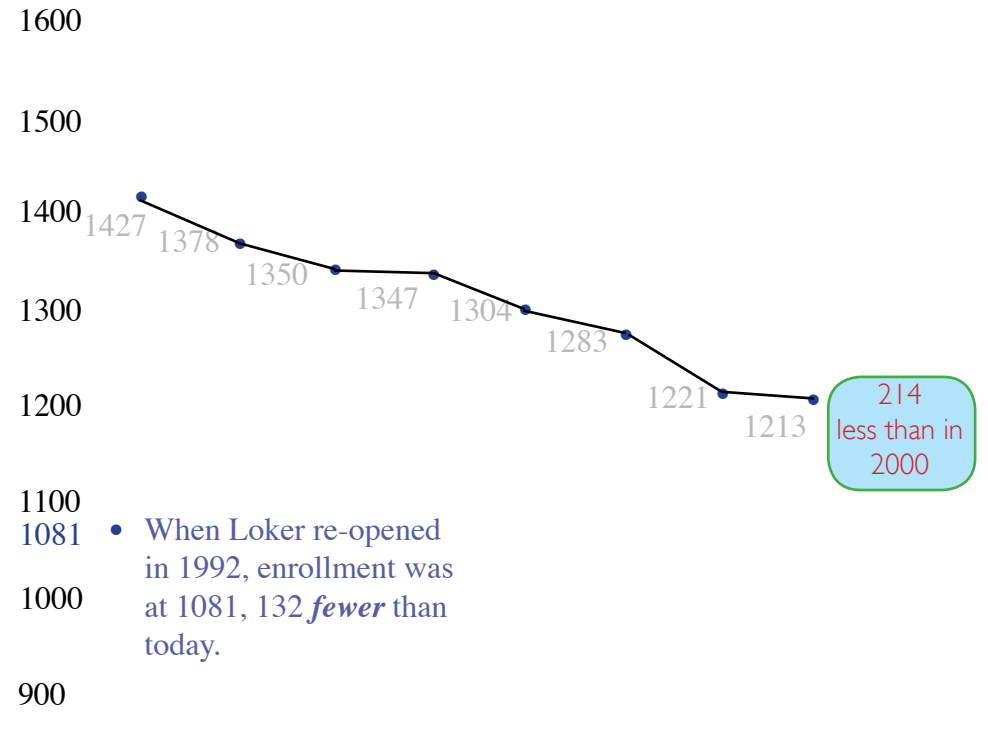
Between 1973 - 1980, there was a dramatic drop in enrollment which resulted in there being 650 fewer students in 1980 than in 1973.

The first 3 years of that period saw a drop of about 200 students.

Over the next 4 years, Loker remained open, only closing when the number of fewer students reached 650, or roughly 41.5% less than at the beginning of the 7 year period.

By contrast, it has taken 7 years to see a drop of only 200 students, and this time when the SC voted to close Loker, the decrease in enrollment has been both slow and gradual.

Rather than the 41.5% drop in 1980, today the decrease has only been 15% from it's peak 7 years ago.

It is also worth noting that we have 132 more students today than in 1980 when the increased enrollment was deemed sufficient to re-open the school.

In 1980, Loker was closed completely, where today it is only half-closed, as it will contain the Kindergarten. However, the 200 fewer students we have today is still significantly less than half of the 650 fewer in 1980.
